Election Notes:

- (1) Democratic electoral votes were cast for two Vice Presidential Candidates: Richard Johnson (147) and William Smith (23). (The 23 votes for William Smith were all cast by Electors from Virginia.) This left Richard Johnson with exactly half the total number of electors and hence, lacking a majority, under the 12th Amendment to the Constitution, threw the election of the Vice President into the hands of the U.S. Senate (for the first and only time). On Feb 8, 1837, the Senate elected Richard Johnson (D) over Francis Granger (W) to be Vice President by a vote of **33 to 16**.
- (2) Harrison Whig electoral votes were cast for two Vice Presidential Candidates: Francis Granger (63) and John Tyler (10), the latter being cast by the Electors from Maryland.
- (3) Electors from the state of South Carolina were appointed by the state legislature (and not elected by popular vote).
- (4) Electoral vote legend for Whigs is as follows: W1 for Harrison, W2 for White, W3 for Webster, & W4 for Willie Mangum.
