Notes: (1) In California, the direct election of the thirteen presidential electors combined with the closeness of the race resulted in a split between the Democratic and Progressive electors: eleven for Roosevelt and two for Wilson. The elector whom received the most votes was an elector for Roosevelt. (2) The Republican Vice Presidential candidate, James S. Sherman, died on Oct 30, 1912. He was replaced by Nicholas Murray Bulter, who received the 8 electoral votes for Vice President that would have gone to Sherman, had he lived.
